



- paper
- scissors
- o glue
- o ribbon



material for decoration (sequins, beads, toffees, glitter, etc.)



Steps:

- 1. Cut a strip of ribbon (colour of your choice). Cut a suitable length that's enough to make a wrist band.
- 2. Draw a marigold flower on the paper and cut it out.
- 3. Decorate the marigold flower with glitter, sequins as per your choice.
- 4. Continue to make flowers until you have the number you wish to put on the ribbon.
- 5. Glue the flowers to the ribbon strip.
- 6. Let it lie flat until the glue is dry.
- 7. Now your friendship-band is ready to be tied around your friend's wrist.






