

We have already learnt in the pervious class that a sentence is formed by a group of words. However, all groups of words cannot be called a sentence.

## Read the following groups of words:

- 1. the east is in the rising sun
- 2. Mohan dog with his plays pet
- 3. farmers fields some are in their working

Can we call them sentences? No, we cannot call them so.

Now, let us rewrite the groups of words as under:



1. The sun is rising in the east.



2. Mohan plays with his pet dog.



3. Some farmers are working in their fields.

Now, these groups of words make complete sense. We call them sentences.

Thus, we see that a group of words can be called a sentence if it fulfils certain conditions which are as follows:

- ♦ All the words in the group should be placed in a proper sequence.
- It should make a complete sense.
- ❖ The first letter of the group should begin with a capital letter.
- ❖ A punctuation mark should be used at the end.

Therefore, we can define a sentence as under:

A sentence is a group of words that begins with a capital letter and ends with a proper punctuation mark. It should also make complete sense.
