

During communication, we need words to express our feelings and thoughts. However, mere use of words cannot make a sentence unless they make a clear sense.

## Read the following groups of words:

- 1. The playing the park are in children
- 2. The big elephant has tusks two
- 3. The night moon in the shines sky

Although the above groups of words have started with capital letters and contain a number of words but we cannot call them sentences and hence close them with a punctuation mark. But why are the above groups of words not be called sentences? The reason is clear. They do not convey any sense.

## Let us read the sentences again after rearranging the words:

- 1. The children are playing in the park.
- 2. The elephant has two big tusks.
- 3. The moon shines in the night sky.





Now, the above groups of words make complete sense. It shows that the words in a group must be put in a systematic order to get any sense out of it.

**Definition:** A sentence is a group of words arranged in a systematic order so that it makes complete sense.

The other necessary conditions that should be fulfilled are: It should begin with a capital letter and end with a suitable punctuation mark.



As is clear from the above definition, a sentence should have at least two words i.e. a subject and a verb. However, 'Go' is the only one word which can be called a sentence. It is in imperative form and the subject 'you' is implied or hidden.
