

We have already learnt that Assertive Sentences are of two types- (i) Affirmative or Positive and (ii) Negative. An Affirmative Sentence can easily be changed into a Negative Sentence by adding 'not' or 'no' to it. This is known as Transformation of Sentence.

There are many ways to transform one type of sentence into another. Let us discuss about a few of them:

A. By Using 'Not'

The most common method of changing an Affirmative Sentence into Negative is by using 'not' with the sentence.

Read the following sentences:

Affirmative	Negative
1. The little boy can run fast.	The little boy cannot run fast.
2. The student is intelligent.	The student is not intelligent.
3. The game is over.	The game is not over.

B. By Using 'No'

'We use 'no' to change an Affirmative Sentence into Negative if the verb is 'has', 'have' or 'had'.

Read the following sentences:

Affirmative	Negative
1. The old man has a lot of money.	The old man has no money.
2. There is a pen in my bag.	There is no pen in my bag.
3. He had rich experience.	He had no experience.

Remember: If 'has', 'have' or 'had' is followed by a main verb, we use 'not' instead of 'no'.

Read the following sentences:

Affirmative	Negative
1. We have finished our work.	We have not finished our work.
2. The train has left the station.	The train has not left the station.
3. He had gone to school.	He had not gone to school.

C. By Using Antonym of an Adjective
