



Read the following sentences carefully:

- 1. John is reading a book.
- 3. Honesty is the best policy.
- 5. All that glitters is not gold.

- 2. The sun sets in the west.
- 4. The mob became violent.

Thus, in the above sentences, John, book, sun, east, honesty, policy, mob, gold are nouns.

Thus, we can say,

The name of a person, place, thing, etc. is called the noun.



Nouns are mainly classified into following kinds:

- **1. Proper Noun**: A **Proper Noun** is a word that refers to a particular member of a class of persons/places or things e.g. *Tom, Tina, Amit, Suresh, Meerut, Agra, Ramayana,* etc.
- **2.** Common Noun: A Common Noun is a word that refers to any member of a class of persons/places or things, e.g. *book*, *boy*, *girl*, *pen*, *building*, *cow*, *chair*, *parrot*, etc.
- **3.** Collective Noun: A noun standing for a collection or group of persons or things considered as one whole, is called a Collective Noun; e.g. *crowd*, *class*, *army*, *regiment*, *mob*, etc.
- **4. Material Noun**: A name given to a material or substance of which things are made is called **Material Noun**, e.g. *milk*, *paper*, *cotton*, *sugar*, *iron*, *gold*, etc.
- **5. Abstract Noun**: An **Abstract Noun** is the name of something which we can neither see nor touch but we can only think of e.g. *honesty, bravery, wisdom, childhood,* etc.

There are two kinds of nouns:

- **1.** Countable Nouns: These are names of persons, animals, places and things that can be counted, e.g. boy, cow, pen, book, table, etc. Countable nouns can be both in singular or plural form.
- **2. Uncountable Nouns**: These are names of things that cannot be counted e.g. *rice, wheat, hair, time, tea, scenery, electricity,* etc. Uncountable nouns can only be written in singular form.

Remember

- The plural of 'fish' is 'fish' or 'fishes'.
- * Names of some games are in plural e.g. billiards, draughts.
- Names of instruments that have two parts are written in plural e.g. scissors, tongs, etc.
- Name of some clothes are written in plural, e.g. pyjamas, shorts, etc.
- ♦ Name of some subjects are written in singular, e.g. physics, civics, etc.
- Name of some diseases are written in plural, e.g. mumps, rickets.
- Abstract Nouns have no plurals!
