



3 Housing and Clothing





Need of a House

A house is a place where we live and rest.

A house protects us from the heat, cold, rain, animals and enemies.

Types of Houses

People live in different types of houses. Houses are of three types: permanent houses, temporary houses and movable houses.

Most people live at one place for a long time. They live in **permanent houses** (Pucca houses).


They are made of bricks, cement, steel and tiles. Due to shortage of land in cities, multistoreyed buildings are constructed.

Temporary houses (Kutcha houses) do not last very long. The most common temporary houses are huts. They are made of wood, bamboo, mud, straw and canvas cloth.



In some places, it rains a lot. So people build **houses on stilts**. Many soldiers and scouts live in **tents** in their camps. Eskimos build a house made of ice, called an **igloo**.

Caravans, camps and houseboats are movable houses.

Gypsies live in house on wheels called caravans.

A camper is also a house on wheels. It can be pulled by a vehicle.

Some people in Kashmir and Kerala live in houseboats.



Buidling Materials

Houses are made of different materials like straw, mud, dry leaves, bamboo, wood, bricks, cement, iron and tiles. People build houses with



materials which they can get easily. In hilly areas people live in houses made of wood. Eskimos build igloos from snow.

Kinds of Roofs

Houses have different kinds of roofs. Roofs may be flat, sloping or circular.

Places that have heavy rainfall or snowfall have houses with sloping roofs. Sloping roofs help the water or snow to fall off immediately. They are made of tiles, tin, asbestos or thatch. Flat roofs are made in hot dry regions. They are made of concrete, cement and iron. Igloos have circular roofs.

Need for Clothes

Just as we need a house to live in, we need clothes to wear.

Clothes protect us from heat, cold, wind and rain.

We wear clothes according to the changing weather.




During summer, we wear cotton clothes.


