Safety Saves



Safety means to keep away from danger. When you sit in the front seat of your car, your parents ask you to fasten the seat belt. When you cross a road, you are advised to look carefully for any vehicle. This is only to keep us safe.

Things which happen suddenly and harm or injure us are called **accidents**. Accidents take place when we are careless.

Therefore, safety rules should be followed everywhere.

Safety at Home

Beware of electricity. It is very powerful and dangerous. An electric shock can kill a human being. Never touch electric wires and electric gadgets or switches with wet hands.







At home, there are many sharp instruments such as, knives, forks, blades and matchsticks. Use them carefully. Never play with them.



Do not leave your toys, bags, shoes, etc on the floor. You or someone else may trip over them. Don't throw fruit peals in open area, someone may slip and get hurt.

In the kitchen, never go near the gas-stove.

Boiling water can burn the skin. Hot oil can also cause bad burns.

In the bathroom, be careful of slippery floors.








Safety at school

To prevent accidents at school, follow these rules:



Do not climb or jump on the desks.



Do not use blade but a sharpener to sharpen your pencil.



Use school equipments carefully.



Do not push anybody in or outside the classroom.






Never run or take two or more steps at a time on the stairways.


Safety in the Playground

We play games to enjoy ourselves. In order to win, players sometimes break



rules and play rough. This may lead to accidents. To prevent accidents in the playground, follow these rules:







Do not hide near bushes.




Do not play games by blind-folding a person.

Safety on the Road

We should be very careful while walking on the road.

To prevent accidents, follow these rules:

- Always walk on the footpath.
- Cross the road only at a zebra crossing.
- While crossing the road, look carefully in both directions before crossing the road.
- Never play on a busy street or on roads.



Wherever possible, we should use subway to cross busy roads.


First Aid

First aid is the first help given to an injured person immediately after an accident. A first aid box should be kept at home and school.

Follow these points while giving first aid:

- Keep calm. Do not crowd around the injured person.
- Call for a doctor or an elder person.
- Do not let the wound bleed. Loss of blood is harmful.
- Loosely tie a clean hanky or bandage over the wound.
- Make the injured sit or lie down. Keep the wounded part high.
- Clean the wound with dettol.
- Comfort your injured friend.
