Safety and First Aid



Accidents are one of the greatest threats to our health and safety. If we are careful, we can prevent most accidents.

Most accidents occur due to carelessness. Accidents can happen anywhere—at home, in the school, in the playground, on the road and in other places too.

Safety at Home

Many accidents can take place at home if we are careless. Follow these rules to keep safe:

- Keep the things in your home in proper order to prevent accidents.
- Keep yourself away from pointed and sharp objects.
- Keep the floor clean. If you spill something on the floor, wipe it off quickly.
- Do not leave your toys and other things lying on the floor.
- Use a step ladder or a stool to reach something high.
- Do not play with fire and matchsticks.
- Never run up and down on the stairs.
- Do not touch an electric wire or a switch with wet hands.





Safety at School

In schools, accidents can happen when children run and push each other. Follow these rules to keep safe:

• Always walk gently in the corridors.



- Do not rush up or down the stairs. You may fall and hurt yourself and others.
- Do not climb on desks and chairs or throw things around.
- Always stand properly and make a queue in the canteen during recess.
- There is heavy rush during recess and after the last bell. Be careful at that time.



Safety on the Road

Road accidents are very common. Most of these accidents occur when safety rules are not followed. You must follow these rules to keep safe:

- Walk on the footpath.
- Use the zebra crossing to cross the road when the lights are green.
- Do not play on or near a road.
- Do not cross the road when vehicles are passing.
- Do not rush. Start out in time.

Safety on the Playground

Playing is great fun. Rules help children to have more fun without having accidents.

These rules should be kept in mind while playing:

- We should not throw things at each other.
- We should never play a rough game.
- The playground should be safe for playing and should not have stones, glass pieces and other such objects littered around.
- Avoid playing with sharp objects, like a knife or a blade.

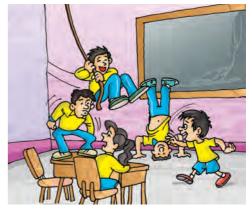
Safety in the Swimming Pool

Swimming is a wonderful exercise. One must follow safety rules strictly to prevent accidents. You must follow these rules to keep safe:



- Never go for a swim alone.
- Do not go into the deep part of the pool until you have learnt to swim perfectly.
- Never push anybody into the pool just for fun.
- Swim only when there is a life guard on duty.







First Aid

First aid is the immediate treatment or help given to a person who is hurt or injured before the doctor comes. First aid is useful in accidents like bleeding, burns, electric shock and so on. By giving first aid, we can help the injured person to feel comfortable, reduce his pain or help him to save his life.

First aid box

We should have a first aid box both in our house and in our school. The first aid box should contain:

- 1. an antiseptic lotion
- 3. a pair of scissors
- 5. a crepe bandage
- 7. a bottle of methylated spirit
- 9. sachets of Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS)
- 2. sterilized gauze and cotton pads
- 4. some band-aid
- 6. an antiseptic cream
- 8. sticky tape
- 10. commonly used medicines

First aid for some injuries

Cuts: When someone receives a cut, wash it thoroughly with clean water. Use dettol or spirit on it. You can also use an antiseptic cream. Cover and also wrap it with a clean bandage.





Bruises: Bruises are caused by a hard blow or a fall. When the bruised area becomes blue or black, you should apply cold water, ice or a towel soaked in cold water on it.

Burns: Run cold water or ice on the burns. Apply suitable ointment and see the doctor.



Electric shock: If a person receives an electric shock from a live wire or any other electric appliance, immediately switch off the main current line. Take the patient to the hospital.

Insect bites: Apply calamine lotion. For bee or wasp stings, apply a paste of baking soda with an antiseptic cream.



Wisdom Corner

Washing hands with soap is the simplest and most effective way to prevent germs from getting or passing on.



If a person has fainted: Make the patient lie down with his head low to increase blood supply to his head. Let him take rest and call for the doctor.

General Rules

Though the type of first aid depends on the type of injury, there are some general rules you should keep in mind when a person is injured:

- Act quickly but calmly.
- Do not create panic.
- Make patient lie down so that he/she feels comfortable.
- Loosen the victim's clothing.
- Keep the victim protected from flies and dust.
- Do not crowd around but immediately send for the doctor.
- Always keep the first aid box handy.
- In case of serious accidents, take the patient immediately to a hospital.

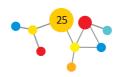

Make up a first aid box and discuss what might go into it. Pupils can make up their own lists and then you can discuss the items one by one. A first aid box could contain: cotton-wool (sterile—free from germs) for cleaning wounds; bandage for wrapping round a wound after it has been cleaned; plasters for small cuts (clean the cuts first); ointment for burns and bites; a pair of sharp scissors for cutting the bandage; antiseptic for cleaning wounds and killing germs.
