In our society, there are two types of families: immediate and extended. An immediate family is made up of parents and their children. An extended family is made up of grandparents, parents, uncles, aunts and cousins. Members of an extended family get together on special occasions like birthdays, weddings and festivals. Family members on the mother's side are called maternal relatives while family members on the father's side are called paternal relatives.



In the ancient times, marriage by kidnaping or abduction was the norm among some tribes. The man would kidnap a woman on his back, keep her hidden for a year and then have a marriage ceremony with the consent of her parents.

New Members in The Family

The number of family members keeps on changing and is never constant. It changes as a new member arrives and an old one departs. The arrival of a baby in the family brings joy and happiness. The baby's birth adds a new member to the family besides bringing a lot of changes. Another occasion which adds a member to the family is marriage of a male member. According to Indian family tradition, after the marriage, the bride comes to live with the bridegroom's family. Marriage and the birth of a baby are happy occasions and the whole family gets together to celebrate them.



Changes in the family also take place when someone, old or young, dies. Death is an unwelcome event as it causes sorrow and brings down the number of family members.

Changes in Family Structure

Old Family Structure

In earlier times, nearly every second family was joint family. The eldest male family member headed the family and took all the important decisions on its behalf. Only the male family members went out to work while the female family members took care of household chores. There were many children in the family. Boys were valued more and considered superior to the girls and so, were provided proper education. The girls were trained in household chores and married off at an early age.

New Family Structure

The family structure has undergone tremendous changes in the last few decades. More often than not, both the parents go out to work. Such working couples hire maids and nannies to look after their children and household. All the decisions in the family are taken with the consent of all. In the present times, boys and girls are considered equal. Both are provided proper education in the field which they desire. Children too leave the family for higher education and better jobs.
