The rat gave the bread to the farmer and got some green grass for the cow. The cow had the green grass and gave some milk to the rat. Then the rat gave the milk to the cat and got his tail back.

Grammar-Grip

Articles

A, An and The are called articles. A and An are indefinite articles. The is called the definite article.

A and An are used before singular countable nouns.

A is used before nouns starting with constant sounds. Examples: a rat, a cat.

An is used before nouns starting with vowel sounds. Examples: an apple, an egg.

The is used before the names of particular things. Examples: the earth, the sun.

The is used before the names of holy books, newspapers, seas, famous buildings, rivers, mountains, lakes, celestial bodies, etc.

- Holy books : the Geeta, the Ramayana, the Bible, the Quran, etc.
- Newspaper : the Hindustan Times, the Times of India, etc.
- Seas/Oceans : the Indian Ocean, the Red Sea, the Atlantic ocean, etc.
- Famous Buildings: the Red Fort, the Lotus Temple, the Golden Temple, etc.
- Rivers : the Ganges, the Yamuna, the Kaveri, the Nile, etc.
- Mountains : the Himalayas, the Aravali, the Karakoram, etc.
- Calestial Bodies : the Earth, the Moon, the Sun, the stars, etc.
