I've counted sixteen chicken pox.


And there's one more-that's seventeen,

- sprained: wrench causing pain and swelling

- wrenched: strong twist
- numb : without sensation
- pendix: appendix, a small organ inside the body near our stomach,
- whisper: to speak softly
