




#### The Alphabet

There are 26 letters in the English Alphabet. These letters can be written in two ways:




We write these letters in a particular order. This order is called alphabetical order.

Consonants: Remaining 21 letters are consonants:






### Naming Words (Nouns)

◆ Common names are called Common Nouns.




#### **Special Names**

Names given to animals and things are also special names, such as: Romi (dog), Balaji Books (shop) and Bhagvad Gita (book).






