



The Olympic Flag, which flies in all the venues of the Olympic Games, is white with five interlaced rings in the centre. The rings are blue, yellow, black, green and red. These rings represent the five inhabited continents of the world joined in the Olympic Movement. It was created in 1913, at the suggestion of Baron de Coubertin, and was used for the first time at the Olympic Games in 1920 at Antwerp.

INCREDIBLE INDIA



India is known for its rich heritage and culture. It is blessed to have many beautiful and historically important monuments with forts, palaces, temples, churches, mosques and archaeological ruins spread all over the country.

Some important sites and monuments of India are given below. Look at the pictures, read the descriptions and write their names.

Located in New Delhi, this observatory was one of the five sites built by Maharaja Jai Singh II of Jaipur. The main purpose of the observatory was to predict the movement and timings of the sun, moon and planets, and to compile astronomical tables. The site consists of 13 architectural astronomy instruments.





It was erected in 1911 on King George V's visit to India. It is located at Apollo Bunder Waterfront in Mumbai. The monument overlooks the Arabian Sea in the most beautiful way.

It is the largest Gurudwara located in Amritsar. Also called *Sri Harmandir Sahib* or *Swarna Mandir*, the shrine was designed by Guru Arjan Sahib. Its foundation was laid by a Muslim saint Hazrat Mian Mir of Lahore on December 1, 1588.





Famous for the Buddhist Cave Temple, these caves are considered to be one of the most important tourist destinations in the world. Located at Aurangabad, the rock-cut caves containing carvings are the finest example of Indian paintings and sculpture.

It is the tallest individual tower in the world and second tallest monument of Delhi. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is located in Mehrauli. Its construction was started in 1192 by Qutb Ud-Din-Aibak, founder of Delhi Sultanate.





It is the largest Dome in India, located at Bijapur, Karnataka. It is the mausoleum of Mohammed Adil Shah, the Sultan of Bijapur. It was built by architect Yaqut in 1656 and is considered as the structural triumph of Deccan architecture.

It is the highest and biggest gateway in the world. It was built in 1572 A.D. by Mughal emperor Akbar to commemorate his victory over Gujarat. It is the main entrance to the palace at Fatehpur Sikri near Agra. It is made of red and buff sandstone and is decorated by white and black marble.





It is a place located 10 kilometres north-east of Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh. It is near the confluence of the Ganges and Varuna rivers. It is a centre of Buddhist pilgrimage, the place where Gautam Buddha delivered first sermon after enlightenment.

It is a 57 ft high statue carved out of a single stone. It was built in 981 A.D. This statue of a Jain sage is situated above a hill in Hassan district, Karnataka, and is one of the longest free-standing statues in the world.





This cave is a Hindu shrine located in Jammu and Kashmir. It is situated at an altitude of 3,888 m and is surrounded by snowy mountains. It is considered to be one of the holiest shrines in Hinduism and is famous for naturally formed ice *Shivlinga*.

Cross country running is a sport event in which individuals and teams run a race on open-air courses. The races are conducted over natural terrain such as grass or dirt. The race course is typically 4-12 kilometres long that include hills, flat ground and sometimes gravel road. It passes through woodlands and open country.
