
Saree, Shervani, Salwar-Kameez, Ghaghra-Choli, Dhoti-Kurta

This consists of a baggy pyjama, a loose tunic and duptta. It is worn by women in Punjab.



This is the traditional male attire and consists of a cloth tied around the waist. The upper garment is stitched and have long sleeves.

It is a long coat/jacket with exposed buttons through the length of the jacket. The length is usually just below the knees. It has a Nehru collar, i.e. a collar that stands up. It is worn with tight fitting pants or trousers. It is usually worn during the wedding ceremonies by the groom.





It is the traditional clothing of women in Rajasthan and Gujarat. Punjabis also wear it, and it is used in some of their folk dances. The part of the clothing worn below the waist is a form of a long skirt which is pleated. It is usually embroidered or has a thick border at the bottom. The upper part of the clothing is a blouse shell garment, which is cut to fit to the body and has short sleeves and a low neck.



Pheran is a traditional dress of Kashmir which is a full length gown mostly worn during winter and is a popula form of dressing amongst both men and women.




This is the most important religious holiday for Jains. It celebrates the birth of Mahavira, the twenty fourth and the last Tirthankara of the present time cycle.

AMAZING PLANTS

The earth is home to about 3 lakh species of plants. The diverse group of plants balance the nature and life on Earth. Some plants produce beautiful pleasant smelling flowers while the others produce nutrient rich foods. Some have medicinal properties and some have totally strange appearance.

Some of the strangest plants around the world are given below. Write their names with the help of the help box.

It is the biggest individual flower in the world. It is mainly found in the forests of Sumatra. It can grow up to a size of 3 feet. The plant produce an unpleasant irritating smell.



This plant is also endemic to Sumatra. During flowering the plant stands at 8.2 feet tall. It is the largest branched main stem concerned to flowering plants in the world. The plant also produces the smell of decomposing animal. It is the smelliest and largest flower in the world. These flowers are protected by law as it is very rare. This plant blooms only in every 40 years.



It is a carnivorous plant, native to South East Asia. The plant has an attractive deep red colour. The attractive smell of this plant helps it to easily catch its preys, which are mainly insects and small animals. Some species of this plant can even consume mice. The deep pitcher-like cavity is filled with special fluid which helps to catch the preys. The plant has most mysterious leaf structure and features special digestive enzymes.



It is another type of carnivorous plant. The plant consumes small insects and animals as food. These plants can be found in the Eastern Carolia especially in wet inhabitants. It has special lobes to trap the prey animals. It closes its lobes immediately when the insects come in contact with the plant.



It is generally known as Euphorbia obesa, native to South Africa. The plant has exactly the same shape of a baseball. It is an unbranched plant with an average height of 20 cm. Male and female flowers grow on different plants. These plants are quite toxic and create severe skin problems. It is protected by National Nature Conservation as it is very rare in the world.





It is also known as 'sensitive plant' or 'shy plant', native to South America. But these plants can be seen all around the world especially in shady areas. The most attractive feature of this plant is nothing but its response to touch. On touching, its leaves immediately fold up. This sensitive nature of leaves is caused by its primitive nervous system which balances flow of water from beneath of leaves.



It is a small ball type plant native to North America forests. It is also called as 'doll's eye' because of its special shaped fruits. Its red thick stems also look very attractive. The flowers are very small with only a size of 6 mm. The fruits of this plant are toxic in nature. This plant has very few leaves and stands 60 cm tall.



This plant can be described as living stones as it looks exactly like stones or pebbles. In fact its unique shape is caused by the merging of two separate leaves at the outer edges of the plant. The leaves grow in very rainy season. Unlike other plants the leaves are brown or grey. This plant can be found in various colours like white, grey, purple and pink. This extremely strange plant species is mainly found in South Africa, which can live for more than 50 years.



This strange plant is mainly found across North America and Europe. It is a special type of fungi that produces blood or juice-like fluid on its surface. It is edible but the blood-like fluid is extremely bitter in taste. It is the scarlet pigment which causes the blood-like colour on the fluid of this plant. It has an unpleasant odour.



It is a unique plant that is found only in the desert of Nambia. It can survive within many extreme weather conditions. This strange species also have separate male and female plants. The most interesting thing about this plant is that it only has two leaves which grow continuously over time. The estimate life span of this strange looking plant is 500 to 1500 years.

DID YOU KNOW?

Great Banyan tree in Botanical Garden of Kolkata in India has the widest canopy in the world. It is estimated to be covering an area of 1.2 hectares.


6 ADVENTUROUS SPORTS

Adventurous sports or extreme sports is a popular term for the sports that involve a high level of inherent danger like speed and height, a high level of physical exertion, and highly specialized gear.

- 1 An activity that involves jumping from a tall structure while connected to a large elastic cord. Usually the tall structure is a fixed object such as a building, bridge or crane, but some people also jump from a movable object like a hot-air balloon or helicopter.
- 2 It is the highest class of single-seat auto racing sanctioned by the FIA (Federation International de Automobile). The cars used in this race are the fastest road course racing cars in the world owing to very high speeds of 360 km/h.





4 It is a form of underwater diving in which a diver uses a self-contained underwater breathing apparatus (scuba) to breathe under water. The diver usually moves around underwater by using fins attached to the feet.



5 It is an activity in which participants climb up, down or across natural rock formations or artificial rock walls. The goal is to reach the summit or the end-point of a usually pre defined route without falling. It can be a dangerous activity and is a physically and mentally demanding sport.



6 It is performed on long, steep slopes in mountainous terrain typically from 45 to 60 + degrees. Because of the extremely long, steep slopes, and dangerous terrain, single mistake at the wrong moment may lead to being seriously injured or killed.
