Sailors of ancient times such as Ferdinand Magellan, Marco Polo and others proved that the Earth is not flat but spherical in shape. Actually, the Earth has an orange like shape, slightly flattened at the top and bottom.

Globes

A globe is a miniature model of the Earth. It shows land and water places on the Earth. We can see all the parts of the Earth by rotating it. It is a ball fixed to a stand in a tilted position as the Earth is tilted in its orbit.

There is an imaginary line on a globe that divides the Earth into two halves. This line is called Equator.

Globe does not show the detailed knowledge about various places. For it, maps are used.

Maps

A map is a pictorial representation of the Earth on a flat surface like paper. It has a scale and chosen symbols or keys. Symbols are used to show particular places like rivers, airports, capital cities etc.


The key explains what do the symbols used in the maps denote.

We can calculate real distance between two places with the help of the map. There are different kinds of maps, such as:

Physical Map shows natural features like land, mountains, rivers, lakes, deserts, plateau etc.

Political Map shows the boundaries of states, countries, village, city etc.

Theme based Map shows different places with same features such as heavy rainfall areas, muddy land areas, areas where rice is grown etc. The people who make maps are called cartographers.




A Physical Map of India

Sketch

The maps drawn on the basis of observations are called sketches. This is just like we remember the way to go to a particular place. It consists of all the important features of a place.

Prominent landmarks are shown in the sketch. The buildings or places that are well known to everybody are called landmarks. They are used to guide somebody to reach a place. It may be a building of bank, hotel or hospital or some monument like the Taj Mahal or some fountain, canal etc.



Directions

Do you know from where does the sun rise? East yes, if you are standing facing the East, the West would be behind you. South is on your right and North is on your left. These four directions are called cardinal directions.

The points where these directions seem to meet are called as North-East, South-East, North-West, South-West.


Continents and Oceans


